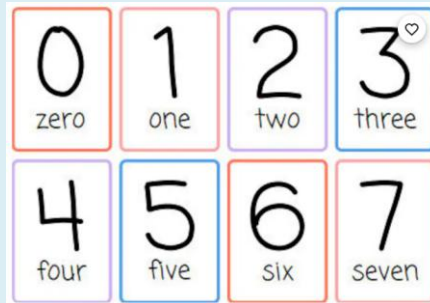


DO
