Pedal Cycle Parking Places (PCPPs) are cycle parking places provided on the road. PCPPs help to free up pavements from being blocked by cycles parked against lamp-posts and signposts. Request an area near you for consideration.

Cycle code of conduct



Lights, both front and back, are a legal requirement on a bicycle. Use them at all times when visibility is reduced.



Ring your bell to alert pedestrians, other cyclists, and other road users that you are approaching.



Visitors to Brighton & Hove may not be aware of the seafront cycle route. Give way to pedestrians where possible. If you are in a hurry use the road.



Cyclists need to follow the Highway Code.



Jumping red lights is illegal. If you do so, you may be fined.



Cycling on pavements is illegal. If you do so, you may be fined.


Cycles on trains

Fully folding cycles (with wheels under 20" in diameter) can be carried on to all trains without restriction, although a cycle cover may be required.

Full size cycles may be excluded from trains at peak times. Reservations may be necessary at other times.

Keep your bike safe



Use cycle parking spaces where provided.

Lock both wheels and the frame to a bike stand or strong immovable object.

Lock 'tight' so your bike is hard to manoeuvre when parked.

Secure your lock so it does not touch the ground.

Cycle security

The police advise bike tagging which helps to deter theft and allows for your bike to be identified. Search for cycle theft at www.safeinthecity.info

It is also important to report stolen cycles or cycle vandalism. Sussex Police have a reporting form on their website.




 Watch out for vehicles turning left

Be aware that vehicles have blind spots




 Bus, van and lorry drivers cannot see all around their vehicles illustrated above in grey are the blind spots
