3rd Aug 1914 WW1 breaks out 8th Aug 1914 Endurance leaves Britain 5th Dec 1914 Leave South Georgia Island 18th Jan 1915 Enter pack ice 24th Feb 1915 Ship routine ceased 24th Feb 1915 Ship cracks under pressure of ice, takes on water, abandoned by crew

30th Aug 1916 Crew rescued on fourth attempt 9th May 1916 Arrive at South Georgia 24th Apr 1916 Five leave on lifeboat to seek help

18th Apr 1916 Arrived at Elephant Island 9th Apr 1916 Set off on foot Mar 1916 Attempts to move camp failed

21st Nov 1915 Ship sinks
